Our Artists

Dr. Elaine Choi immerses herself in the choral community as a conductor, educator, adjudicator, and collaborative pianist. In addition to her role as Artistic Director of Pax Christi Chorale, she is Director of Music at Timothy Eaton Memorial Church, and was previously the conductor of the University of Toronto Soprano/Alto Chorus.

As a music educator, Elaine is active as an adjudicator and a clinician for various community events such as the Toronto Kiwanis Music Festival, CAMMAC reading sessions and Toronto Mendelssohn Choir Singsation Saturdays. Most recently, Elaine was the guest clinician of the 2022 Bangkok International Choral Festival in Thailand.

Elaine is an advocate for Chinese Orchestral and Choral music. She was the conductor of the Toronto Chinese Orchestra from 2010-2017 and currently continues her connection as Guest Conductor and Educational Outreach Representative. In 2018, Elaine founded Babel, an SATB choral ensemble with a mission to bridge cultures through choral music. The ensemble worked with more than 200 musicians in Hong kong, Taiwan and Macau in its inaugural tour in 2019.

Pax Christi Chorale was founded in 1987 and consists of a warm and welcoming community of singers of all ages and walks of life. Our overarching aim is to experience the deep joys of choral singing, and to communicate that joy to our audience. As part of our mission to be a leader in choral music performance and education, our membership is enriched every year by four professional choral leads, four choral scholars, and apprentice members. Our outreach program includes the annual Children's Messiah concert in December and a series of school workshops.

Joshua Tamayo is a pianist, conductor, composer, and arranger. His passion for music comes from the 10 years he spent with St. Michael's Choir School in Toronto, where he specialized in organ and sacred choral music. Josh's love for conducting blossomed when he was 12 years of age when he had the honour to be the guest conductor of the Sudbury Symphony Orchestra. He later pursued music at the University of Toronto, majoring in piano

performance. Josh was appointed Collaborative Pianist with Pax Christi Chorale in the fall of 2022.

Hogtown Brass is a dynamic Canadian ensemble of accomplished musicians from a variety of diverse artistic backgrounds. Known for their unique arrangements and new compositions, collaborations with vocalists and instrumentalists, along with an affinity for both standard and non-traditional performance spaces, Hogtown Brass is on a mission to reinvigorate the entire concert experience for their audiences.

Hogtown Brass is committed to presenting unique concert experiences, as well as entertaining and informative educational programs including workshops, masterclasses, and residencies. Recent performances include: TD Toronto Jazz Festival, Guelph Connections Concert Series, Richmond Hill Centre for the Performing Arts, Toronto Chamber Players, CityTV Carol Sing, and a tour through Atlantic Canada with performances in Dartmouth, Lunenburg, Atlantic Festivals of Music, as well as a residency with the Sistema New Brunswick music education program.

Hogtown Brass has released two albums – A Holiday Album, Vol 1 (2017) and Introducing...(2016), both featuring new Canadian compositions and arrangements. Introducing...was nominated for a 2017 Toronto Independent Music Award.

Strong advocates for the creation of new repertoire – Hogtown Brass has commissioned and recorded new pieces by composers Kevin Lau, Cait Nishimura, and Samuel Bisson, with their creation made possible by the Ontario Arts Council, FACTOR, the Toronto Arts Council and the Canadian Music Centre.
